A Message From the President:

The Board of Trustees has voted to call an emergency congregational meeting

for a vote to authorize the Board of Trustees to engage an Interim Minister. Unfortunately, as we have gotten further into the process, we are now understanding from the UUA schedule for the Interim Minister Search process that we will need to be ready to make an offer on May 17th, which is before our Annual Meeting on May 21st. This is the excerpt from the Albany UU bylaws regarding this:

Section 6. Interim Minister and Other Staff

- A. The Board may engage an interim minister after such action has been authorized by the membership at a congregational meeting.
 - B. The Board may engage other staff as deemed appropriate.

We will hold this emergency congregational meeting on May 7th at 11:45pm.

We hope you will make it a priority to attend so we can move forward with the process of engaging an Interim Minister to serve the congregation for the next two years.

Updates on the Interim Minister Search process will be provided on a regular basis to the Congregation by the Interim Search Committee.



As of April 30th masks are no longer required at service or in groups for children and youth on Sunday mornings. People who prefer to continue to

wear a mask are encouraged to do so, and seating for people who wish to sit in a section with other masked attendees is available in the balcony and in Community Hall. Look near the eastern sides of those locations for signs indicating seating reserved for masked attendees.

You are of course welcome to sit anywhere with your mask on; these spaces are simply intended to provide an option for mask-wearing folks who feel more comfortable sitting near others who are also wearing a mask.

Ushers need to be aware of this change, so that you can answer questions and direct people as needed. Please do what you can to ensure that the designated seating is reserved for those wearing masks.






