



A Message From the President:

A Message From the President:

As many of you are already aware, this Sunday, May 7th at 11:45 am there will be an emergency congregation meeting. The Board of Trustees has requested this meeting because, per our bylaws, the Board of Trustees must receive authorization from the congregation in order to engage an interim minister. We have received a number of questions about this meeting, so I am hoping to provide clarification here. The purpose of this meeting is for the congregation to decide that they do or do not want to have an interim minister so this is a yes or no vote.

The process with the UUA provides the search committee with several candidates that they can interview and do references on. Then the search committee prioritizes the candidates and sends that information to the UUA. The Interim Minister candidates also provide a prioritized list of congregations they are interested in. The UUA then matches the Interim Ministers with a congregation and we finalize the offer and contract at that point culminating on May 17th.

We wish that we had a better understanding of the timing of the process earlier on so we wouldn't be asking for a vote so close to the date the UUA will notify us of the potential match. Thank you for your understanding as we work through this process. We hope you will make it a priority to attend so we can move forward with the process of engaging an Interim Minister to serve the congregation for the next two years. All are welcome to attend the meeting, however only those who have been members for at least 30 days are able to vote.


